**BACK TO NATIVES RESTORATION AND STUDENT VOLUNTEERS FROM TARBUT V'TORAH
PLANT NATIVE PLANTS IN WILLIAM R. MASON REGIONAL PARK**

IRVINE, Calif., October 15, 2007 – **Back to Natives Restoration** and 35 student volunteers from Tarbut V'Torah in Irvine, will plant native plants in William R. Mason Regional Park on Wednesday, October 17 at 8:15AM. The native coastal sage scrub plants will improve habitat for animals and beautify the area for human visitors.

WHEN: The students will arrive at the main park entrance at 8:15AM on October 17, then walk to the planting site within the park's wilderness area. Once planting is complete, the students will continue with trash clean up until 10:30.

WHERE: William R. Mason Regional Park is located at 18712 University Drive in the City of Irvine. To reach the park take the San Diego Freeway (405) to the Culver Avenue exit. Head south on Culver to University Drive, then turn West (right) to the park entrance (on left).

WHO: Tarbut V'Torah Community Day School is a K-12th grade educational facility located in Irvine, California.
